Scriptures to Explore with Questions & Core Concepts Deuteronomy 6:1-25 Who is this God and what does it mean to serve him ONLY?

Daniel 7:1-4 How did the ancients understand the supremacy of the Son of Man?

Matthew 26:36-46 Passion narrative: why was it "not possible" for the cup to pass? God apparently thought it was necessary?

Mark 2:1-12 Jesus claims to have the authority to forgive sins. Who else claims authority to forgive sins?

"I AM" Statements in John 4:26; 6:20; 6:35, 41, 48, 51; 8:12 and 9:5; 8:24, 28; 8:58; 10:9; 11:25-26; 13:19; 14:6; 15:1-5; 18:5-8 Jesus made several claims in John that equated him with the I AM of Israel, and in so doing, he claimed to be God

Acts 4:12 The early church saw the gospel as exclusive / "No other name".

Acts 17:16-31 The early church saw the gospel as exclusive / Paul's sermon in Athens on other gods.

Romans 3:23; 6:23 The early church saw the gospel as exclusive.

1 Corinthians 15:12-18 The early church saw the gospel as exclusive. If the resurrection is not true, we are of all people most to be pitied.

2 Timothy 2:15 It's worth studying so we know what we believe and can be unashamed.

2 Timothy 3:10-4:8 The truth of what we believe shapes our lives, our ministry, our thinking and our very souls for salvation.

Related Tenets of InterVarsity's Doctrinal Basis

"The only true God, the almighty Creator of all things, existing eternally in three persons Father, Son, and Holy Spirit full of love and glory." (Tags: exclusivity, creation, trinity, nature of God, love of God, glory of God, pluralism, interfaith, tolerance/intolerance, community in trinity, eternity)

"Jesus Christ, fully human and fully divine, who lived as a perfect example, who assumed the judgment due sinners by dying in our place, and who was bodily raised from the dead and ascended as Savior and Lord." (Tags: Christology, example of Christ, life of Christ, image and likeness of Christ, claims of Christ, substitutionary atonement/other orthodox models of the atonement (beyond penal substitution), judgment, sin, physical bodily resurrection, ascension, salvation, Lordship/authority of God in the life of the believer)

"Justification by God's grace to all who repent and put their faith in Jesus Christ alone for salvation." (Tags: soteriology, justification, repentance, salvation, grace, faith, exclusivity of Christ, pluralism, tolerance/intolerance, interfaith, orthodox models of justification (beyond penal substitution))

"The victorious reign and future personal return of Jesus Christ, who will judge all people with justice and mercy, giving over the unrepentant to eternal condemnation but receiving the redeemed into eternal life." (Tags: restoration of all things, now and not yet, second coming, kingship, kingdom, judgment, justice, exclusivity, pluralism, tolerance, mercy, hell, redemption, eternal life)
